The Primary sector

The primary sector of the economy extracts or harvests products from the earth. The primary sector includes the production of raw material and basic foods. Activities associated with the primary sector include agriculture (both subsistence and commercial), mining, forestry, farming, grazing, hunting and gathering, fishing, and quarrying. The packaging and processing of the raw material associated with this sector is also considered to be part of this sector. There are not so many people working in this industry as the values profit wise have become less and now the more modernised job for example jobs in profession or office jobs are more valued in the business industry.

Three examples of the primary sector would be:-

- BP (a National company):- British Petroleum is company which extracts oil then sell the oil at a profit to fulfil the needs of workers extracting the oil. Although the wage for this is low this job is still valued within this sector as we use oil and gas throughout our everyday lives for cars and transportation. BP is actually within all three sectors of the business as BP also provides general convenience for the public from the shop at every petrol station.
- Rushall Farm (Regional Company): Rushall farm provides wholesome healthy food in a sustainable way. In this case Rushall farm works to provide food made healthier without the use of fertilisers and also using more of the earth's resources. This business could also be seen as a secondary sector as it processes and makes its own organic food.
- Windsor Estate Forestry (Local Company): This business grows tress to cut and use for different types of businesses. For example the wood extracted from the trees could be used as firewood or wooden furniture. This is a regional business based with in the county of Berkshire. This business also aims to keep the environment healthy and clean for the many habitants within it.

The Secondary Sector

The secondary sector of the economy manufactures finished goods. All of manufacturing, processing, and construction lies within the secondary sector. Activities associated with the secondary sector include metal working and smelting, automobile production, textile production, chemical and engineering industries, aerospace manufacturing, energy utilities, engineering, breweries and bottlers, construction, and shipbuilding. We could also say that materials provided from the primary sector are processed into goods suitable for us for

example the wood from the Windsor estate forestry would be used as furniture in The Worshipful Company of Furniture Makers.

Three examples of this sector would be :-

- Land rover (National Company): For the -past 60 years this company
 have made different types of cars suited for everyone. The cars are made
 from metal made in the primary sector these would include alloy,
 aluminium & Magnesium. Land rover also would be mentioned in the
 tertiary sector of business as after making the product they then sell it for
 a profit. This is a national company could also be classified as worldwide
 Land Rover is based throughout different counties all of the England
- Shoogle (Regional Shoemakers): shoogle is classed as secondary business as it designs and makes shoes for the public's uses. This includes bags & hats made from leather the original source of shoe material. This is a regional company as it operates within many stores throughout Guilford.

Tertiary Sector

The tertiary sector of the economy is the service industry. This sector provides services to the general population and to businesses. Activities associated with this sector include retail and wholesale sales, transportation and distribution, entertainment (movies, television, radio, music, theatre, etc.), restaurants, clerical services, media, tourism, insurance, banking, healthcare, and law.

Examples of this sector are:-

 British Airways (National Company):- This company is based throughout all airports within the u.k. this provides a service towards customers who want to travel abroad.
