AIM

For my GCSE Coursework, I have chosen the topic of Tourism. The aim of my project is to find out the whether tourism has any: i) environmental impacts, ii) Economic impacts, or iii) Social impacts on Caerleon.

ANALYSIS

Fosse lane had the most amount of litter out of all five areas. Fosse Lane is situated next to the Roman Barracks so the litter could have been caused by tourists. On the other hand Caerleon School is also situated on the end of Fosse Lane, so the most likely explanation is that the litter has been caused by school children, as it is a popular lane for them to walk amongst. The only area that comes close is the Bull Inn. The Bull is situated in the High street of Caerleon and is not often walked among with the tourists as there is no main tourist features or landmarks their. Residents and members of Caerleon go around that area as there are local shops and the Bull is a local pub, popular with the locals.

Tourists usually arrive in Buses and Coaches as means of transport and the most coaches are parked in the Fosse Car Park as the amphitheatre is situated next to it. The most amount of traffic was caused by private motor vehicles most likely to be owned by residents or workers of Caerleon. The most amount of traffic occur at the Bull Inn as it is situated on the main High street of Caerleon, whereas other areas in question are not on main streets.

My Environmental survey shows that I felt that the most ugly and uninviting area was the Broadwalk. No tourists normally would go down the Broadwalk, as it is a Residential street mainly used by residents. The Fosse area is pretty average and is the main area for tourists and the best areas were the Red Lion and the Bull Inn as the locals like to look after their local pubs, and no tourists are usually found in those areas.




CONCLUSION

The aim of my project was to find out the whether tourism had any: i) environmental impacts, ii) Economic impacts, or iii) Social impacts on Caerleon.







ANALYSIS

METHOD

For my project, following Data was collected in these places/areas of Caerleon: -

- 1. Fosse lane
- 2. Fosse Car park
- 3. The Bull Inn
- 4. The Red Lion (Church Street)
- 5. The Broadwalk

I choose these five areas in Caerleon because they are all areas next to a major tourist site of Caerleon. The Roman Barracks are next to Fosse lane, The amphitheatre is next to Fosse Car park, The Bull Inn is near the Museum, and The Red Lion is near the Roman Baths. The Broadwalk is a residential area, chosen to see if there is a difference between results from a tourist area.

Data was collected on a Friday morning and was collected using the same methods in each of the five areas.

Data was collected using the following methods: -

- 1. Litter survey to show if tourism has an effect on amounts/type of litter.
 - An area of 15 meters by 2 meters was randomly measured in each of the areas before counting.
- 2. Traffic count to see if there are different levels of pollution (noise and air).
 - We counted every vehicle that passed and tallied the amount and type.
- 3. Environmental evaluation survey to evaluate each area and to compare areas.
 - I measured my responses to each of the areas.
- 4. Human impact survey to assess how much of an impact humans have had on each site.

I also used a questionnaire to find out how much of an impact tourism has on Caerleon and the persons life and a shopkeepers questionnaire to find out whether tourism had an effect on the economy of Caerleon.
