Do you think recycling helps the environment? I asked this to see what people opinions are on recycling.

Do you think that recycling should be compulsory everywhere/ I asked this because in some other places it is already compulsory. So I wanted to see everyone else's view on it.

My next question is:

Where is your nearest recycling centre? I asked this to see if people are aware of where their centre is

My next question is:

To encourage people to recycle, do you think people should be fined if they do not recycle? Explain your answer

I asked this because I wanted people opinions and see if they agreed or not Finally my next question is?

Do you think waste is the most dominant environmental problem in Brent? I asked this because there are other problems in Brent that show great concern as well as waste so I wanted to know what the public thought.

Planning And Collecting Secondary Data

Within the UDP policies section in the leaflet we see that the council has recently launched a major recycling enterprise. Facilities have been located throughout the borough for the collection of waste and the intention is to expand these facilities into the 'bring' system of recycling utilising minirecycling centres.

These facilities would be found on supermarkets forecourts and car parks. The reason for this is to encourage shoppers to come and recycle their waste there when they come shopping. This also makes things convenient for them. New industries, warehousing and offices development are expected to take part in recycling and the collection of waste.
