















Observations: I have observed from these results several things, firstly that the majority of people coming to the shop lived very close to it, this explains why convenience scores were so high. Secondly that the prices in the store were generally not low (with few exceptions) and that they were about 10 pence higher than items at a supermarket. Also I noticed that people go to this shop for items such as Tobacco, sweets chocolates and drinks as these were some of the most popular items in my survey.

Conclusions: I conclude from my results that, my local store "Shop and Save" stays open for several different reasons they are, firstly that the shop is not located near another competing store as this could put sales down, making less profit or even putting it out of business. Secondly that nearly all the goods in the shop were over its plateau price in some cases by 10 or so pence. Thirdly that if people want goods like food, Tobacco alcohol, and other drinks it would either be easier or more economical to walk to their

local store rather than waste petrol by driving to the nearest supermarket, which provides exactly the same goods anyway. I believe this last factor Convenience, is the biggest because it is exactly why Local stores exist, people cannot always get to the nearest supermarket easily and Stores like this provide similar goods to some of the supermarket ones.
