Detailed research plan.

Visit County Library

Using Library search engine input "24 hour society" and other variables
Note down the placement number of the section
Go to that section and collect books that seem most relevant
Scan through books and look for information on the 24 hour society
Mark places in books with bookmarks
Check out the books and take them home for heavier research

Find a computer with Internet access

Go to a search engine such as http://www.google.com / http://www.yahoo.com / http://www.yahoo.com /

Type in the key work '24 hour society'



Scan through search results for relevant sites
If sites are too general try using bouillon commands such as '+', 'AND' or 'NOT'
From results copy relevant information in to a word processing program such as
Microsoft Word and edit it down in to useful points
Save and print

Find a person with information you would like to here from him/her
Ask if you could record the conversation to write the report
Ask the person the questions and push for a detailed response
When you believe you have enough information thank the person for their time
Use the recording to help write your report

Objective 2

Information

The 24 hour society is an expression offered to characterize the present modern society. The 24 hour society is one in which certain activities are performed around the clock. Some 24 hour systems include 'NHS' Direct, Online voting in New York, and 24 hour supermarkets persivically Piggly Wiggly the first online supermarket to provide a virtual pharmacy. Piggly Wiggly partnered with Minneapolis based Grocery shopping Network (GSN) to launch an e-commerce strategy that will provide online pharmacy services and grocery shopping through the Piggly Wiggly consumer web site http://www.pigglywiggly.com.



Stores can set up online shopping via the pigglywiggly.com site or through their own unique web sites, or both. According to Richard Varnon, director of e -commerce for Piggly Wiggly Company, the new Piggly Wiggly virtual pharmacy will enhanc e the service and convenience already provided by Piggly Wiggly retail supermarkets and add an important e-commerce element to the company's business-to-consumer web site. It is clear from piggly wiggly's history that they have all ways been forward thinking:

Piggly Wiggly, America's first true self-service grocery store, was founded in Memphis, Tennessee in 1916 by Clarence Saunders.



Piggly Wiggly was the FIRST to...

- ...provide checkout stands.
- ...price mark every item in the store.
- ...Give shoppers more for their food dollar through high volume/low profit margin retailing.
- ... Feature a full line of nationally advertised brands.
- ...use refrigerated cases to keep produce fresher longer.
- ...put employees in uniforms for cleaner, more sanitary food handling.
- ...design and use patented fixtures and equipment throughout the store.
- ...franchise independent grocers to operate under the self-service method of food merchandising.

The 24 hour society has been very effective, Internet shopping and banking are now nothing unusual. In my interview with Daniel Adams Internet shopper he quoted
