

## **Build Your Own WebSite!**

The World Wide Web or the Internet as it has become commonly known is perhaps the greatest communication medium that most of us will experience in our lifetime. ### **So how do you start?**

### **Determine your Purpose!**

### **Design and Creation.**

### **Tools:-Counters/Guestbooks etc.**

But if it's not - there are literally dozens of free providers available many of which will not only provide you the space but also the tools you need to get yourself started, you will find many of them listed in the webmaster section of the [directory](#), all offering a range of free services. These are great for beginners as they allow you to practice your skills and 'get your feet wet' gaining some very useful experience perfecting both your site and your skills. But long term, particularly if your site is successful and the budget allows it - you will want to purchase your own domain name and get away from free hosting. You will get to a point where it will start to work against you and as your traffic and web presence builds, you will need a provider with a superior service such as [ClaraNet](#) or [Active ISP](#).

### **Funding Your Site.**

As time progresses you will probably want to consider how you could benefit financially from your site - or at least cover your costs if you have made the jump to a 'paid for' host. Just a word of warning here though - there is no get rich quick scheme, making money out of your site takes as much effort as it's production in the first place, particularly in the early stages. But as your site takes off so will your finances and some people who are willing to put in the time and effort in actually do earn a very good living from it! There are a range of programs you can choose from but we would recommend (especially in the early years of your site) that you select some with a good reputation and that focus on your particular area of expertise. These should get you started and may probably be the only programs you'll ever need, but as always if they're not for you - have a look at the growing selection in our directory.

### **Getting Traffic To Your Site**

Ultimately this is what it is all about - attracting visitors to your site. The more visitors you attract the more successful you will be and that's true whether you decide to try to earn some money from your site or not. This is one of the hardest thing to

achieve - to get people to your site in the first place - and with out doubt the best way way to get traffic, is to manually enter your sites details into as many search engines as possible.
