General Purpose: To persuade.

INTRO:

I: Attention:

BODY:

B: 80% of the developed world's diet originated in the tropical rainforest.

- 1) Things such as fruits, vegetables, spices, coffee and nuts.
- 2) At least 3000 types of fruits are found in rainforest, 2000 of these are used by rainforest Indians, while only 200 are used by western world.

C: Rainforest provides animals and people with habitat.

- 1) One hectare (2.47 acres) may contain over 750 types of trees and up to 1500 species of higher developed plants.
- 2) 90 tribes of rainforest peoples have become extinct since the 1900's and continues to rise as destruction increases.

Transition: *With the importance of this subject stressed now it is time to talk about what we can do to save the rainforest.*

II: We must preserve our rainforests at whatever before it is too late. The following are things we can do to positively impact our rainforest.

A: Funding for positive practices practiced in rainforest instead of subsidizing harmful activities.

- 1) Harvesting nuts and fruits instead of clearing land for paper products.

B: A force should be deployed to maintain a steady rate of clearing and battle illegal logging companies.

C: People need to start recycling and not be so wasteful.

- 1) People should try to recycle all plastic items and paper products they consume.
- 2) As well as recycle people should use porcelain plates instead of paper and all round try to reduce paper product consumption

D: Support responsible paper product companies.

- 1) Look for FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) logos on paper products
- 2) Donate to places like ran.org and savetherainforest.org.

Transition: *If everyone helps just a little bit our lives will be affected minimally, however if we do nothing and continue in our ways it may be the gravest mistake of our lives.*

CONCLUSION:
